Key Stage 4 Results

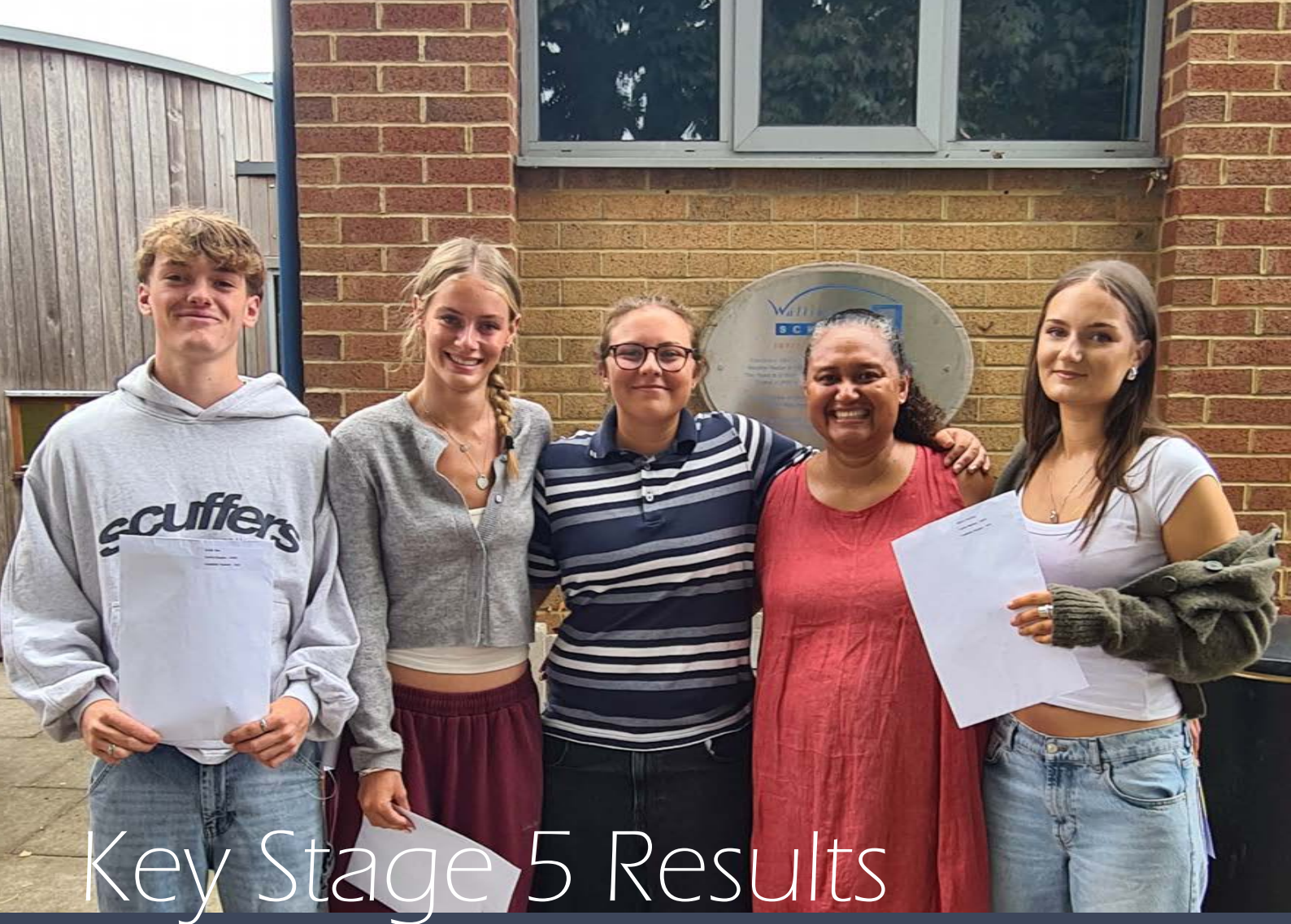
Our Key Stage 4 results at headline levels are outstanding and aptly reflect the quality of teaching and learning and support at the school and the hard work, ability and commitment of the young people who have achieved them.

Beneath the headlines there are a great many individual stories of students who have excelled, be it with a string of top grades or who have achieved or exceeded their targets or overcome challenges or difficulties in their lives. We celebrate the achievements of each and every young person at Wallingford School as they look forward now to the next step in their lives.

The headline figures in terms of grades for the 220 students in the year group are:

English 4+	81%	Maths 5+	70%
Maths 4+	86%	English and Maths 5+	63%
English and Maths 4+	81%	5 or more grade 7s	29%
English 5+	72%		

Wallingford School Sixth Form now numbers around 300 students in total with the vast majority of our students choosing to remain at the school for their Sixth Form years and a large number joining us from other schools who become quickly integrated into our school.



We are tremendously proud of our Year 13 students' A Level and BTEC results. This has been a year group which has worked incredibly hard and brought a huge amount to our school both within the classroom and beyond.

Destinations are broad and varied and almost all students have managed to secure a place at their institution of choice with students going on to study a fascinating mix of competitive courses at universities and colleges across the country. Equally, those who might be having a gap year or going into work-based training are very well-set for future applications and options.

In summary, for the students in Year 13 this year:

11% of all entries gained A* grades

61% of all entries gained A*-B grades

31% of all entries gained A*-A grades

100% of all entries gained A*-E grades

A huge thankyou must also go to the staff at Wallingford School who have supported these young people over the past two years – and in most cases for seven years - and also to their families who have shared their journey for every step of the way.

Congratulations to each and every young person who has received their results this summer and we wish them well for what we are certain will be very bright and promising futures.
