



PROVIDER ACCESS STATEMENT

May 2025

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1. Wallingford School Provider Access Policy Statement

Under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022 we have a duty to provide students in Years 8-13 with access to providers of post-14, post-16 and post-18 education and training. This policy statement sets out how we manage access requests from these providers.

2. Student Entitlement

Students in Years 8 to 13 are entitled to:

- Learn more about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which informs students of the full range of education and training options available to them at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities on offer, for example, technical education and apprenticeships this can be achieved through options evenings, assemblies, group discussions, and taster events.
- Understand how to apply to the full range of academic and technical courses available to them.

All students in Years 8 to 13 will receive at least six encounters with accredited providers of technical education and apprenticeships. These encounters will be divided accordingly:

- During the first key phase (Year 8 to Year 9) all students must attend two mandatory sessions by accredited providers.
- During the second key phase (Year 10 and 11) all students must attend two mandatory sessions by accredited providers.
- During the third key phase (Year 12 and Year 13) there will two sessions by accredited providers these will be optional for students to attend. [Please note that it is mandatory for the school to put these specific sessions on; however, attendance is optional for students.]

3. What Opportunities Are Provided to Allow Access to Students?

Via our school careers programme (available on the school website), we offer providers numerous opportunities throughout the school year to speak to students and/or their parents.

These sessions will be scheduled during the school's main opening hours.

The school offers the six provider encounters that are legally required – these are marked with bold text below – and a number of additional events.

During these sessions, at a minimum, providers will be given enough time to:

- Share information about the provider and the approved technical qualifications and apprenticeships they offer.
- Explain what career routes these qualifications and apprenticeships could lead to.
- Provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider.
- Answer students' questions.

6. What Are the Rules for Granting and Refusing Access Requests?

We will grant access requests that meet the following criteria:

- Are in writing.
- Give the requester's name and contact details.
- Describe the purpose of the request in detail.

We will refuse any access request that:

- Is deemed to be detrimental to students' welfare.
- Would cost too much staff time or money to process.
- Would significantly disrupt the effective running of the school.
- Repeats a previous request from the same organisation.

7. What Can Providers Expect Once a Request Has Been Accepted?

Once we have approved a provider, we will work with them to identify the best method for providing access to our students.

We will make the school hall, classrooms and/or private meeting rooms available to host discussions between providers and students. We will also make presentation equipment, such as projectors / audio, available to providers.

Arrangements will be discussed in advance between our careers staff and a nominated member of the provider's team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus and other relevant course literature with the school.

8. How Are Complaints Regarding Provider Access Managed?
